

County Budget for FY 2020/2021 Kshs 6, 317,790,554.00


- Equitable Share received from the National Treasury Kshs. 4,272,750,000.00 which is 68%


KIRINYAGA COUNTY BUDGET ALLOCATION FY2020/21

SUMMARY OF DEPARTMENTAL ALLOCATION IN A GRAPH




HIGHLIGHTS OF EXPENDITURES



1. HEALTHCARE



Priority I: Investments in accessible Health care to ensure a productive population

Preparing the County to handle COVID-19 Pandemic

- (i) Total Investment Kshs. 2,335,991,680
- (ii) Salaries for Health workers: Kshs. 1,582,621,527

The County Government is undertaking massive health sector reforms in line with the provision of Universal Health Coverage for Kirinyaga residents.



The ongoing construction of modern medical complex at Kerugoya Hospital will transform the facility to a state-of-the-art Level Five Hospital. On completion, the complex will have an ICU, a HDU, an outpatient wing, theatre, emergency and casualty department, pediatric, surgical and medical wards, counseling and palliative care, Pharmacy, CT scan and X-ray and specialist consultancy

2. WEZESHA



Priority II: Transformation of livelihoods through investments in the agricultural for increased productivity and profitability.

Total Investment **Kshs. 590, 485, 221**-from (Development Partners - World Bank **444,435,221** (**82%**) County Contribution-**96,050,000** (**18%**)


- (i) Beneficiaries 3,000 households supported totaling 15,000 residents
- (i) National Coffee revitalization Programme (Cherry Revolving Fund) Kshs 50 Million

To empower women, the youth and people living with disabilities, the county government is implementing economic empowerment program through four agricultural value chains namely poultry, dairy, avocado and tomato as well as an apparel factory that engages women



Wezesha program involves about 3,000 households comprising of about 15,000 people.

Priority II: Investments in infrastructure developments to support agricultural production

Upgrading County access roads to all-weather, grading of access roads and bridges construction

Total Investment Kshs. 178,533,937

Examples of Infrastructure constructions

- (i) Mahiga-ini Bridge- Kshs. 6 Million
- (ii) Gachuria Moyo Bridge- 17.1 Million
- (iii) Kiandieri- Kabumbu Bridge (kandakame River) **5.9 Million**



To attain sustained local economic and social development the county government continuously undertakes improvement of rural access roads network through grading, murraming and construction of bridges and drainage systems. This eases transportation of goods and opens up the rural areas for investment opportunities.

4. URBAN SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT AND ACCESSIBILITY TO CLEAN AND SAFE WATER



Priority IV: Urban solid waste management and Accessibility to clean and safe water

Keeping County clean through Garbage Collection, Improvement of our Urban Centers and environment protection while supporting livelihoods.

The county government is keen on responding to growing needs brought about by urbanization in Kirinyaga County and has therefore streamlined solid waste management.



To ensure regular garbage collection, the county government has invested heavily in modern equipment that include garbage collection skips and trucks.
