EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report shows performance in budget implementation by County Government entities for the nine months of 2023-24 FY. The report covers two major sections; the revenue analysis section and the expenditure analysis. In the revenue, the report details the total revenue collected during the period under review in the revenue streams and classifications. This part also indicates the current status of revenue collection target for the period. The second part analyses both the recurrent and development expenditure by the County Government entities in nine months of 2023-24 FY.

The County Government's total approved budget for 2023-24 FY amounts to Kshs 7,240,547,406. Recurrent allocation of Kshs 4,791,443,225 and Development allocation of Kshs 2,449,104,180. In the period under review, recurrent expenditure amounted to Kshs. 3,389,233,963 which represents 70.7 % of recurrent budget. Development expenditure for the period under review amounted to Kshs. 774,550,034.

Own Source Revenue target for Financial Year 2023/24 is Kshs. 550,000,000. Revenue collected in the nine months amounted to Kshs. 472,817,832. This represents 86% of total annual revenue target.

1. INTRODUCTION Legal basis for preparation of quarterly reports

This report is prepared in accordance with section 166 (1) and 166 (4) of the Public Finance Management Act 2012. The act requires that, "An accounting officer for a county government entity shall prepare a report for each quarter of the financial year in respect of the entity". Further, "not later than one month after the end of each quarter, the County Treasury shall—

(a) Consolidate the quarterly reports and submit them to the county assembly;

(b) Deliver copies to the Controller of Budget, National Treasury and the Commission on Revenue Allocation; and

(c) Publish and publicize them.

2. REVENUE ANALYSIS

The approved resource envelope for 2023/24FY Kirinyaga County Budget amounts to Kshs. 7,240,547,406 which will be financed as per Table 2.1 below.

Own Source Revenue

The County has a projected own source revenue target of Kshs 550 Million in the FY2023/24 Budget. During the nine months of 2023/24 actual Own Source Revenue collected was Kshs 472,817,832.00. This indicates a performance of 86% on annual own source revenue targets. This nine months performance indicates a 10% increase in collection from a similar period in 2022/23.

Own Source Revenue for the nine months has indicated an upward growth especially from 2017/18 FY. This years growth has grown by 10% from a similar period in the previous year.

Disbursements from Equitable Share

Disbursements from Equitable Share follows an approved disbursement schedule. Amounts to be disbursed are on monthly bases before 15th of every month. Table 2.3 shows disbursement of equitable share for the nine months of 2023/24. It is identified from the disbursement dates that there is a significant delay in receiving disbursements. During the nine-month period, the county has only received disbursements for six months. This has contributed to delays in meeting Government's financial obligations.

Recurrent Expenditure

Total recurrent expenditure for nine months of 2023/24FY amounted to Kshs. 3,389,233,963 which represents 70.7% of the total recurrent budget estimates. The major contributor to the nine months expenditure is the County Health services sector. Total nine months recurrent expenditure for this sector amounts to Kshs. 1,508,879,110. This indicates a 44.5% of the total nine months recurrent expenditure in the county. This also represents a 71.3% absorption rate for this sector.

Development Expenditure

Development expenditure for the period under review amounted to Kshs. 774,550,034. This represents 31.6% absorption rate. This is a 17% increase in expenditure compared to a similar period in 2022/23FY which recorded development expenditure amounting to Kshs 660,644,174.
